## **SNAPSHOT OF ADA**

### Did you know that

14.2% of people in Pennsylvania report having a disability.

## In other words, nearly 1.8 million people in PA

experience a visual, hearing, cognitive, ambulatory, self-care, or independent living disability according to estimates gathered by the 2017 American Community Survey conducted by the US Census Bureau. This number does not capture persons with upper body disabilities or persons with psychological/mental illness, which means that the number of people with disabilities is even higher.

Nationwide, 12.7% of non-institutionalized population in the U.S. reported a disability according to the same study, meaning that over 40 million people in our country are living with a disability.
